FEDERAL GOVERNMENT FINANCE

The total revenue and grants decreased by 2.9 percent to Birr 8,966 million in the first quarter of 2008/09 from Birr 9,236 million in the fourth quarter of last fiscal year. Year on year basis, however, total revenue and grants rose by 27.4 percent. In addition, the performance of quarterly revenue was 19.9 percent of the total annual budget.

On the other hand, quarterly Federal Government expenditure declined by 6.8 percent to Birr 10,188 million although it surged by 33.8 percent on annual basis.

Hence, despite birr 6.31 billion current surpluses, the overall fiscal deficit (including grants) widened to Birr 1.22 billion compared to Birr 574 million deficit during the same period last year.

7.1 Revenue and Grants

Total revenue and grants mobilized during the first quarter of 2008/09 reached Birr 8.96 billion of which Birr 8.71 billion (or 97.2 percent) was from domestic sources and the balance (Birr 249 million) from CPF grants. Besides, about 59.5 percent of the domestic

revenue was from taxes, and 40.5 percent from non-taxes. The amount of CPF grant during the reported period was 91.1 and 74.3 percent lower than that of the preceding quarter and the same period of last fiscal year, respectively.

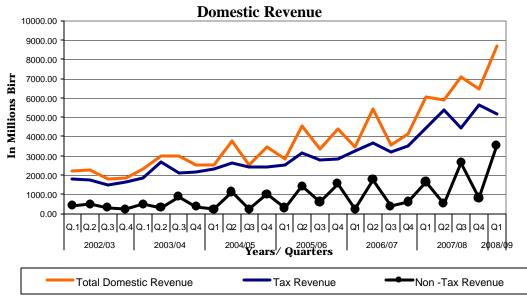


Fig. VII.1 Quarterly Developments in Major Components of

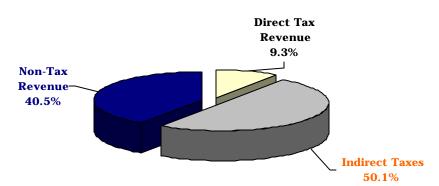


Fig.VII.2 Domestic Revenue (by Major Components) during First Quarter of 2008/09

Some Birr 8, 72 billion domestic revenue collected in the first quarter of 2008/09 was 35.1 and 43.6 percent higher than the revenue mobilized in the preceding quarter and a year earlier, respectively.

Tax revenue at Birr 5.18 billion fell by 8.2 percent over the previous quarter mainly due to a decline in direct tax revenue by 17.1 percent. On annual basis, however, tax revenue registered a 17.1 percent growth. As usual, tax revenue mainly originated from indirect taxes, accounting for Birr 4.3 billion (84.3 percent) of the total domestic revenue

garnered during the review quarter. The revenue from indirect taxes went up by 22.7 percent vis-à-vis the same quarter last year.

On the other hand, direct tax revenue, which mostly comprises of personal and business income tax, fell to Birr 815 million, exhibiting an annual decline of 6.0 percent as tax collection from businesses slowed down despite substantial increase in revenue from personal income taxes.

7.2 Expenditure

The total Federal Government expenditures including regional transfers stood at Birr 10.19 billion during the stated period, about 33.8 percent higher than the corresponding quarter of last year. The 6.8 percent quarterly decline in the total expenditure was due to a slow down in the capital expenditure by 20 percent.

Of the quarterly total expenditure, Birr 2.41 billion (or about 23.7 percent) was channeled to finance current expenditures and Birr 4.16 billion (or 40.8 percent) to various development

programs. The balance (35.5 percent) was allocated for regional transfers.

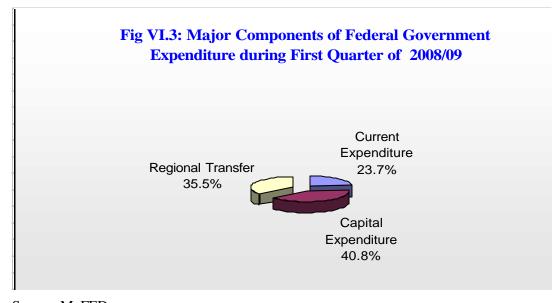
Year-on-year basis, recurrent expenditures increased by 37.1 percent as all the components of the expenditure went up. Capital expenditure also surged by 47.8 percent as a result of higher social and general development expenditures, despite significant declines in general development expenditure. Regional transfers also showed a surge by 19 percent growth over the same period of last fiscal year.

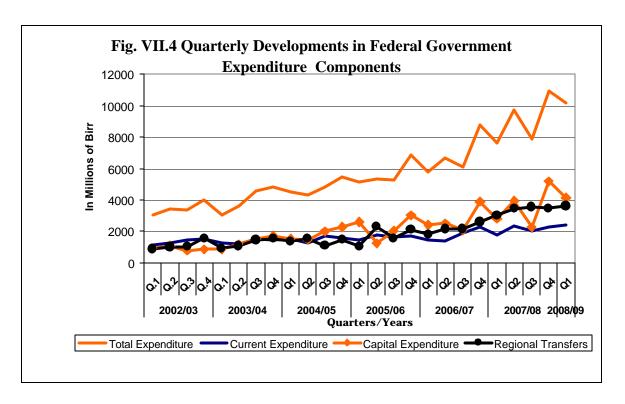

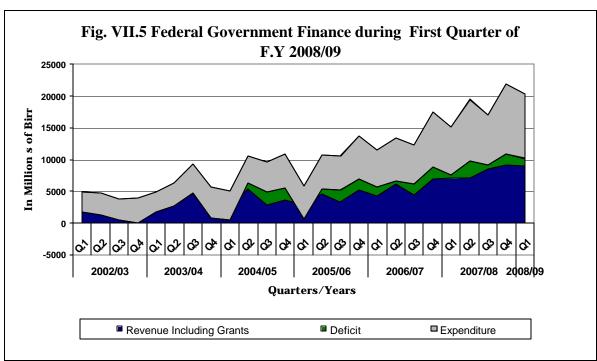

7.3 Deficit Financing

As indicated earlier, Federal Government budgetary operations resulted in an overall deficit (including grant) of Birr 1,22 billion, which was significantly higher than that of last year

same quarter by Birr 469. The fiscal deficit was financed by Birr 478 million net external borrowing and Birr 598 net domestic borrowing with Birr 146 million as residual and others.
